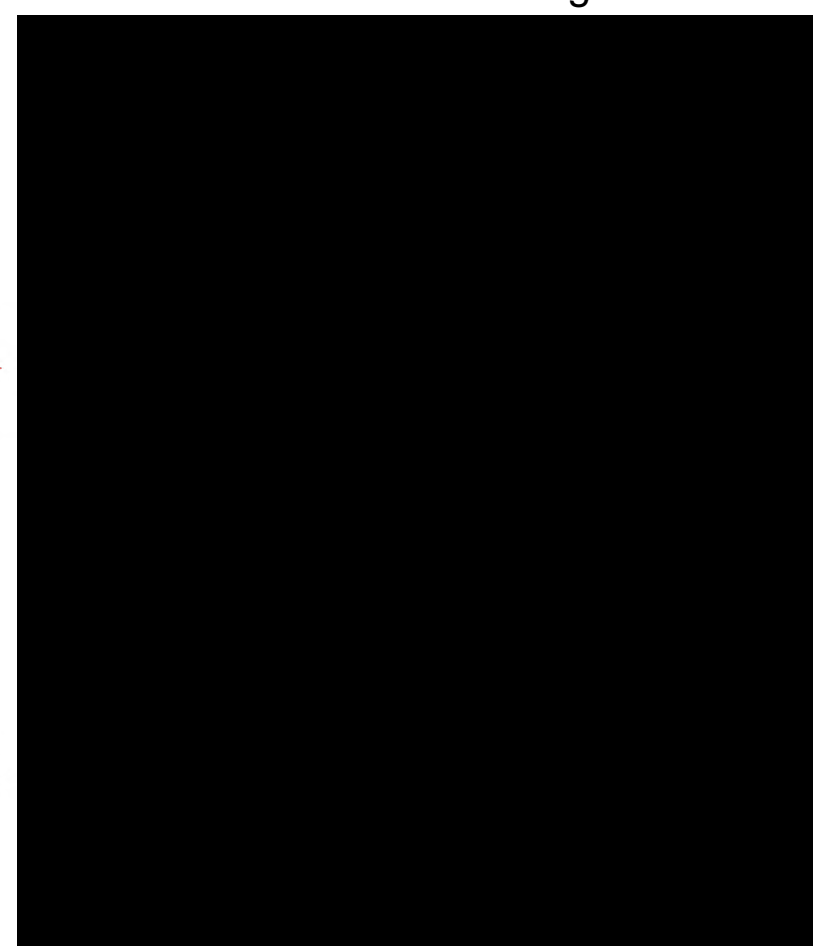
Christmas Play
