### Order of displays

1. 'Will your anchors hold' a popular hymn for RNLI services – arrangement by the RNLI committee.
2. 'Where is love' from Oliver – arrangement by Lorraine Jasper of Bruallen Nursery.
3. 'Circle of Life' from the Lion King by Port Isaac Pre-school Playgroup.
4. 'Climb every Mountain' from The Sound of Music - Arrangement by Bess Coates and Golden Circle members. The Golden Circle is one of the most venerable organisations in the village and so are some of the members. Living in Port Isaac we know all about hilly walking, if not mountain climbing, and we share our memories and dreams at our monthly meetings.
5. 'Jesus Christ Superstar' from the show of the same name – arrangement by Joan Murray and Christine Hawkey for the Carn Awn Singers. We are a group of 11 local lady singers who enjoy getting together and singing for charities. We have chosen Jesus Christ Superstar as we feel it is appropriate, and some of us have enjoyed seeing the show.
6. 'Over the Rainbow' from The Wizard of Oz – Arrangement by Diana Maberly for the Julian Group. The Julian Group meets each month to meditate and contemplate on a

- text chosen by a member of the Group. The name is taken from Mother Julian of Norwich. Mother Julian was an anchoress, an author, a theologian, mystic and spiritual advisor.
7. 'If I were a rich man' from Fiddler on the Roof – arrangement by Emma Crooks and Sue Barlow for the United Benefice Healing Group. Our healing group for the United Benefice meets once a fortnight for a Eucharist and Laying on of hands. We have intercessory prayers and Taize hymns are incorporated into worship. Our chosen subject tells of a poor Jewish peasant who, as he plays his violin on his roof in a Russian shtetl, dreams of becoming rich.
  8. 'My Fair Lady' – arrangement by Noreen Honey and Yvonne Cleave for Port Isaac Fishermen.
  9. 'Midnight' from Cats – arrangement by Liz Bartlett for St Endellion Church.
  10. ✓ Memorial Tables.
  11. ✓ 'Josephs Coat' from Joseph and his Technicolour Dreamcoat – arrangement by Rosemary Williams for St Peters Church. An arrangement to convey something of the life of Joseph, from his youth as a country shepherd boy, his dreams and his maturity as right hand man to Pharaoh in the land of Egypt, fulfilling God's plan to preserve life during the seven year famine.
  12. 'Maria' from West Side Story – arrangement by the Rector for the Mothers Union.
  13. 'Oh I do love to be beside the Seaside' – arrangement by St Kew Church.
  14. 'Lord of the Dance' from the musical of the same name – arrangement by Dee Randell and Marion Essam for Trio. The first Trio came out in 1982 and since then some 212 issues have been published. It is now a 24 page monthly newsletter for Port Isaac, Port Gaverne and Trelights, full of news and views of the place and its people.
  15. 'South pacific' – arrangement by Suzanne Barriball and Marion Andrews for the Friends of Port Isaac School.
  16. 'Oh! What a Beautiful Morning' from Oklahoma – arrangement by Port Isaac Local Artists Group. The group, now about 14 in number meet in winter at 10am each Wednesday, venue Church Hall. Exhibit attempts to celebrate the joy of life.
  17. A selection of pictures from Port Isaac School.
  18. 'Hallo Dolly' – arrangement by Noreen Honey and Yvonne Cleave for Port Isaac and District Garden Society.
  19. Arrangement by Ann Steer for the History Group.
  20. 'Jesus Christ Superstar' from the musical of the same name – arrangement by Dee Randell and Marion Essam for the Village Hall. Built in 1895 as Port Isaac's Temperance Hall, the Village Hall was recently refurbished by the BBC TV programme, DIY SOS. It was a weekend of true 'community spirit' and we now have a Village Hall we can be proud of.
