

Chorale finale tops off a wonderful Port Isaac flower festival at St Peter's

SENSATIONAL singing and the sweet smell of success were on the agenda when St Peter's Church, in Port Isaac, held a fundraising flower festival last weekend.

The waft of wild flowers welcomed visitors to the event, which was based around a nursery theme, while a wonderful concert by members of the Port Isaac Chorale lifted the congregation's spirits on Sunday evening.

Aided by a money collection and home-made refreshments, organisers believe that the festival raised more than £1,000 for church causes and thanked everybody who attended.

Margaret Cann, who is one of two church wardens, said:

"We had 24 exhibits and a table for remembrance, and it all made for an excellent show.

"Dee Randell from Secrets printed a superb programme, Janet Chadband co-ordinated the event, while the nursery rhyme exhibit by Yvonne Cleave impressed everyone who visited the festival.

"We were surprised by the number of children who did not know many nursery rhymes, but I think that it brought back memories for many parents!"

The church's next event is the Harvest Festival on September 7, when the highlights include an auction of harvest goods and singing by Fisherman's Friends.
