The Diocesan Common Fund obligation is increasing annually. i.e. 1994£2,796 - 1995£3,240 - 1996£3,684 and will continue to rise for the next few years as the major responsibility for the funding of the Churches Ministry, both Diocesan and Nationwide, shifts from the Church Commissioners to the Parishes.

We only manage to balance our books through the money we receive as fees for weddings and funerals, which amount to around £2.50 a week, and through fundraising events.
