



St Samsons, Middle Street

St Samsons was probably named after the sixth century Irish missionary who landed at Trebetherick to travel across to Fowey via Golant, to sail to Brittany where he eventually became Archbishop of Dol. The cottage has steps up to the former 'chapel' front door.

The present ground floor was once the cellar where the village lamplighter's equipment was stored. The lights were lit at dusk and extinguished at 10pm
