



The Slipway Hotel

A datestone indicates that there was a building here in 1527.

In the early 1800s the present building was built and was a Chandlery owned by **Warwick Guy**.

It was later taken over by Guy Hawken and his wife; he ran an ironmongers shop on one side and she ran a drapery shop on the other. Guy Hawken's shop is now the dining area of the Slipway Hotel. It sold almost everything; sweets, apples, flour, haberdashery, ironmongery, slabs of Sunlight soap, seven pound lumps of rock salt, fish hooks and bird hooks.

In time it became an Hotel. It has had several owners including Mr & Mrs Reece and their two daughters, Jackie and Jo, Mr & Mrs Evans and their son Trevor, Mr & Mrs Carpenter and their children Barry and Angela and the Bishop Brothers.
