



This house on Church Hill was built on the site of the old Conservative Club.

In the 1930s: “Once the Liberal Club was built on the corner of Fore Street and Back Hill , nobody wanted to climb Church Hill so the building was turned into living accommodation.” ***Yvonne Cleave***

Further up Church Hill, on the site of a new house, was a small bungalow owned by Garfield Hancock and then by his son John. Behind the bungalow was a quarry known by the name of Warra Tarra. Garfield Hancock was the Dynamite Man at the quarry, involved with blasting the stone. Several cottages in the village were built from this stone. The last person to work this quarry was Ernest Hoskin, known to all as Driver.
