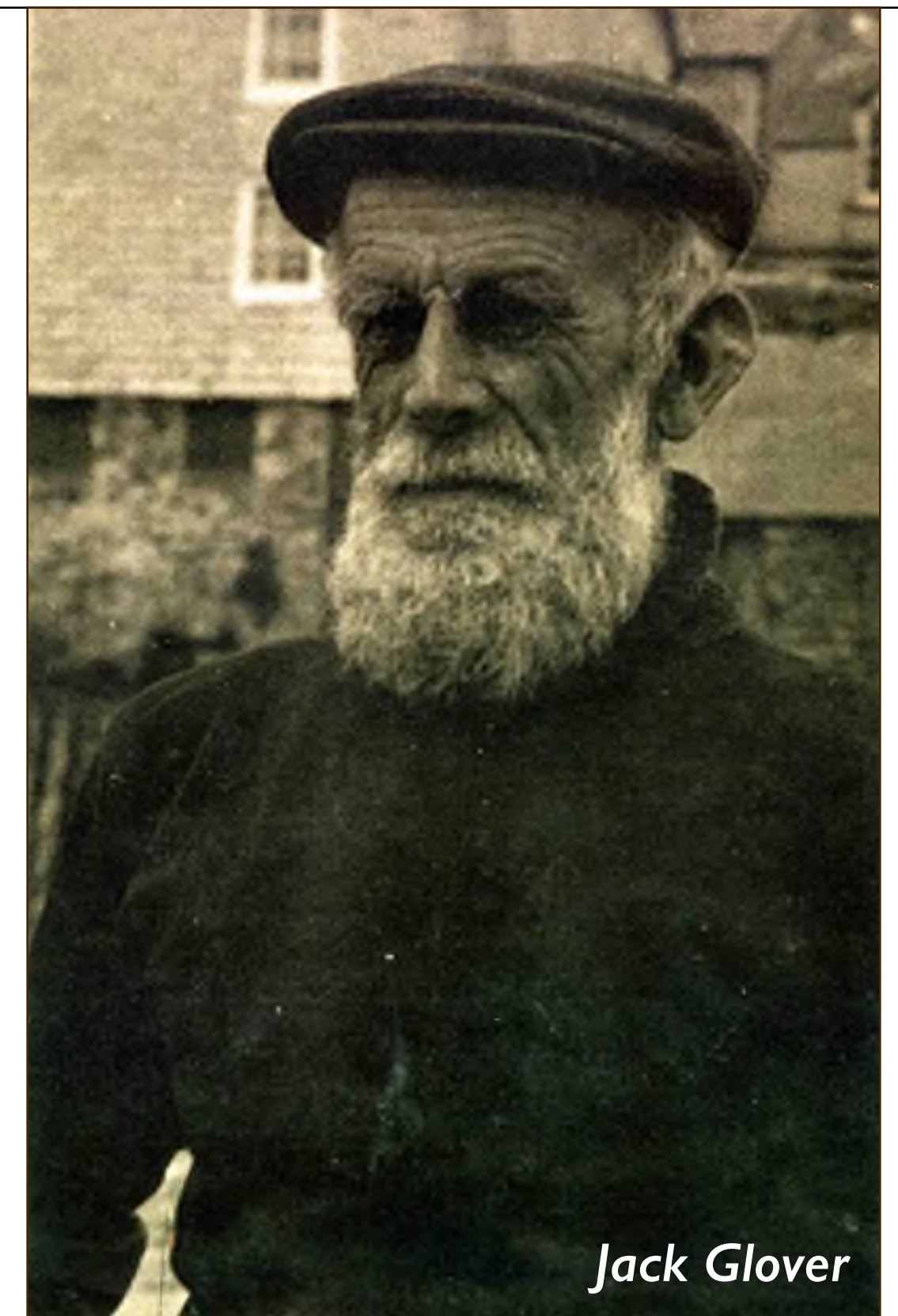
Tom Collins, who is 78, says: "Fifteen miles of cycling every day keeps me a youngster."
