

THE TREVAN FAMILY HOME

The Trevan's Port Isaac home was the property currently called *White House Cottage* on Roscarrock Hill. Having an uninterrupted view of the comings and goings in the harbour, it would be just the place for the senior local Customs official.

This black and white photograph, taken c1965 by Robin Penna, shows the cottage as Trevan would have known it.



The cottage subsequently collapsed and was rebuilt to conform with building regulations, thus destroying its traditional Cornish cottage shape.



The property in Dolphin Street now called Trevan House, was subsequently the home of John's brother Frederick Trevan, the village doctor.



In 1834, Frederick was living in the adjacent property, now called Vesta Cottage, which has an old plaque "A Trevan 1812" above the door.
