## Porth Karn Hvn

... in the old Cornish language 'Port of the Rocky Haven' and now commonly called 'Port Gavern', is a small unsafe cove but where the principal business in this parish is carried on, mostly in the shipping of slate of which from 3,000 to 4,000 tons are annually shipped from the Delabole slate quarries. Likewise, when pilchards are caught great quantities are cured here ... On the eastern entrance of the cove, parts of the neck of land has been cut through with bounds of earth thrown up on the outer side. It is supposed to have been done by the Ancient Britons for a place of retreat in times of danger.

The five families who reside here at present are headed by *Captain Edward* **Richards**, *Digory* **Strout**, *Betsy* **Lobb**, Widow, *John* **Lobb** and *John* **Inch**.
